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SYNOPSIS

The last few years of the millennium marked a transformational period for the Icelandic underworld. What had been a relatively innocent playground for petty criminals and "hobby pushers" progressed into the organized and violent industry that prevails today.

BLACK'S GAME takes place during turbulent times, using as framework a handful of real events from the period; the Ecstasy revolution, two armed bank heists, a large scale insurance scam and the biggest drug-bust in the country's history. All these events shook Icelandic society profoundly, not least because of the high level of professionalism.

DIRECTOR'S BIOGRAPHY

A native of Iceland and a graduate from NYU's Film Department, Oskar Thor Axelsson, born 1973, has extensive background in TV commercials production.

Axelsson's numerous short films are his NYU thesis, MISTY MOUNTAIN (2007), a nominee for the Student Academy Awards and winner of three Craft Awards at NYU's First Run Film Festival and the award-winning comedy NYLON (2003). BLACK'S GAME marks Axelsson's feature film debut. Based on an Icelandic best-selling novel, it chronicles the true story of how Iceland's underworld came of age in the late 1990s. Axelsson is represented by William Morris Endeavor (WME) Entertainment.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

"BLACK'S GAME chronicles a part of Iceland's recent history that I'm fascinated with. Around the turn of the century, the local crime scene progressed into the organized and violent industry that prevails today. I sometimes like to call it a coming-of-age tale of the Icelandic underworld. The main character, Stebbi, is in many ways an Icelandic everyman. And his eagerness to impress and belong is in a way typical for the country of Iceland in the company of larger nations. He is (we are) always trying to play in a league above. But that can sometimes take its toll! As much a lover of movies as a filmmaker, my key goal has always been to enjoy both the making of BLACK'S GAME as well as viewing it in the theatre. At least I can say the first part has proven quite successful..."
